WHITE, Private, CHARLES EDWARD, T/207895, 10th Bn., The Queen's (Royal West Surrey Regiment). formerly, Surrey Yeomanry (Queen Mary's Regiment) 26 March 1918. Age 20. Son of William and Mary White, of Electra House, Haslemere, Surrey. Enlisted in 9th Lancers. Sept., 1914. Also served in Italy. Bay 2.

FORSTER, Second Lieutenant, WILLIAM EDWARD BLAKE, 30th Bty., Royal Field Artillery. and "C" Sqdn., Surrey Yeomanry (Queen Mary's Regiment), Died accidentally 12 June 1915. Age 28. Son of William George and Jessie Jane Rose Forster of The Anchorage, Marine Parade, Tankerton, Whitstable, Kent. Born Streatham, Surrey. Grave Ref. 509.

REIGATE CEMETERY, Surrey, United Kingdom

CLARKE, Second Lieutenant, FRED, 105th Sqdn., Royal Air Force. formerly, Surrey Yeomanry (Queen Mary's Regiment), Died of accidental injuries received in aeroplane accident at Castlebar, Co. Mayo 6 June 1919. Age 34. Territorial Force Efficiency Medal.

Husband of Doris Florence Clarke, of "Highbury," Grovehill Rd., Redhill. Born at Sutton Bridge, Lincs. Grave Ref. I. 3907.

DODGSHON, Second Lieutenant, JOHN HAMPSON, Royal Flying Corps. and, Surrey Yeomanry (Queen Mary's Regiment) 1 October 1916. Son of Rose Hooper (formerly Dodgshon), of The Cottage, 99, St. James's Rd., Wandsworth Common, London, and the late Edmund Dodgshon. Instructor at Central Flying School, Upavon. Grave Ref. 7.
