Dec 4th Commanding Officer made inspection of all billets in the Battalion. Each man was standing by his bed. Major L.H.B. Lethbridge reported his arrival to the Battalion from No. 3 I.T.C. I wish all ranks the best of luck in their new role'. Dec 11th Bn. H.Q. Skeleton Exercise held. N.A.A.F.I Canteen opened. Dec 12th Bn. training in camp. Dec 13th Ash Range allotted to Bn. Dec 14th Bn. X-Country Run. Dec 15th Bn. Church parade held in Parish Church, Hartley Row. Preacher: Rev. Rees Jones - Padre of 2 Bn. Beds and Herts Regt. Dec 16th/17th Div. Skeleton Exercise held.
