

1/7 Bn. The Queen's Royal Regiment (West Surrey) War Diary October 1942

OCTOBER 1942

- 1st D. 2 0030 hrs Orders for night attack cancelled. Bn. to move one Coy forward to cover "D" Coy 1/5th Queen's and Bn. to be prepared to attack above positions during afternoon D. 2. 0400 hrs. recce of Coy area complete. Patrol to enemy wire failed to contact. 0600 hrs "C" Coy proceed to covering position SOUTHEAST of pt. 101. In position 0730 hrs. 0600 hrs rations delivered 10 hrs late.
1000 hrs Orders received from Bde. H.Q. cancelling attack. Further orders 1230 hrs. 0800 hrs to 1130 hrs some enemy shelling. Capt. E.V. Isaac O.C. "A" Coy. injured. 2/i/c O.R. True took command "A" Coy. 1230 hrs. Orders from 131 Bde. to occupy defensive positions. "A" Coy area depression, and, Pt. 94 ref. 883260 "B" Coy tongue feature 88362603 "C" Coy cairn 92 88412607 "D" Coy to Pt. 96 88532605.
1430 hrs relief and re-organisation started Bn. H.Q. to old location pt .93 88472603. Carrier Pl. to form screen area SOUTH EAST pt. 101. until dusk covering Coy of 1/5th Queen's. Some intermittent shelling. 1730 hrs. Relief complete.
Bn. assumed location as on D day. "B" Coy mine-laying during night. Patrol C.Q.M.S. Baker .H. and 2/Lt. R.G. Dever to Pt. 101 heard compressors working. 2/Lt. T.C. Godfrey and 2/Lt. W.C.F. Cross direction Pt 94 investigated old minefield.
Morning digging and wiring of new minefield. Re-organisation A/Tk layout completed. 1830 hrs. some shelling Bn. H.Q. Warning Order of relief 3 Days by 2 Buffs: 1 Coy by 4 R.W.K. Bn. to relieve 4 R.W.K. in HOGSBACK. Patrol sent out this night.
Capt. J.R. Mills and Sgt. Crozier D. to Pt. 94 - 2/Lt. C.R. Clarke to Pt. both report enemy strengthening posns. .94 strongly held several MMG's.
- 2nd D. 3 Adj. to A/Q conference on relief details.
Recce Parties 2 Buffs, 4 R.W.K. (for "D" Coy) visit posns.
0900 hrs. Bn. advance partly under Major J.C. Colebrook left for HOGSBACK area. Orders for relief at night - time unstated.
1020 hrs. Advance party from 2 Buffs arrives.
1330 1415 hrs. Heavy thunderstorm. Considerable rain and general drop in temperature.
No enemy activity in Bn. Area.
1730 hrs. Some intermittent shelling in Bn. Area.
2100 hrs. Relieving Units started to arrive.
2245 hrs. "D" Coy relief completed.
2300 hrs. "B" Coy relief complete.
- 3rd D. 4 0010 hrs. "A" Coy relief complete.
0140 hrs. "C" Coy relief complete.
0145 hrs. Bn. H.Q. marched out.
0600 hrs. Bn. in new area (HOGSBACK) with "B" "C" & "A" Coys forward "D" Coy in reserve.
Total casualties of this operation -
Killed NIL: Wounded officers 2 O.Rs 2. Missing O.R 1. Bn. strength on relief Officers 30 O.R's 676.
- 4th Bn. resting, checking and reorganising equipment. There was intermittent shelling in "B" Coy area no casualties, 2/Lt. R.C. Davis reported to Bn. from I.B.D. and posted to "A" Coy. Lieut. F.G. Sarah reported to Bn. from I.B.D. end posted to "D" Coy. 37 O.R reinforcements from I.B.D. reported to Bn.
- 5th Bn. continued checking and reorganising. Lieut. G.S.D. King attd to Bde se J.L.O. w.e.f. 5.10.42. Recce patrols under Capt. J.R. Mills & Lieut. D.L. Fennell sent out under Bde arrangements.
- 6th Heavy rain during early morning. Day dull and overcast. A concert was held during the afternoon in the area of 1/5 Queen's under Bde. arrangements. O.O. No. 3 issued.

	1/7th Queen's Bn. to maintain outpost positions by night in area's 88412660 & 88422650 for the purpose of preventing enemy patrols approaching (HOGSBACK) and Munassib Depression posn.
7th	Heavy Mist in early morning, O Group conference reference move to relieve 5 R.W.K. (PUNCH BOWL area 882263 night 9/10/. General Horrocks Corps. Comdr. addressed Bn Officers on the attack on MUNASSIB DEPRESSION and the lesson to be learnt from this attack.
8th	O Group Conference giving final instructions with regard to move. Advance party to new area leaves O/O No. 4. issued.
9th	Bn. preparing to move to new area. Advance party from 4 R.W.K. arrives. 1730 hrs. Bn. move commenced. Coys by march route moved in the following order D Coy Bn. HQ H.Q. Coy A/Tk Pln. C, B, & A Coys. Coys moved into following positions D. Coy 88222634 – Bn. HQ 88242639 – C Coy 88242645 – B Coy 88292637 – A Coy 88332635 – R.A.P. & H.Q. Coy 88442648.
10th	PUNCH BOWL. 0210 hrs. Bn. take over completed. A Coy provides two listening posts at points 88332628. "B", "C" & "D" Coys patrol wire to their front. "D" Coy strengthened at night by 1 Officer and 24 O.R's from Carrier Pl. 0730 hrs. Smoke mortar bomb fell front of "B" Coy area. 0745 hrs. Heavy mist "Stand to" ordered for 30 mins. During morning and afternoon 50 mortar bombs fell in and around "B" Coy area, one O.R. Casualty. Weather dull with rain at times. 2300 1 O.R. "B" Coy injured by mine or booby trap and later died of wounds. Listening posts and wire patrols continued, working parties improved defensive posns. by wiring of minefield. Bn. sent 1 recce patrol out at night under 2/Lt. W.C.F. Cross to minefield area 88072652 (NTR).
11th	Intermittent shelling during morning of "B" Coy area - no casualties. Recce party from 7 Green Howards (69 Bde) visited Bn. H.Q. Major Colebrook left to recce new area. "O" conference (Warning Order) for move to DEIR DAAYSIS 428874 night 13/14, Oct. Capt. B.H. Ibbitson posted to M.E. O.C.T.U. as an instructor. 2/Lt. C.R. Clarke took recce patrol to area 882262 approx. NTR. Lt. F.G. Sarah took recce patrol to Pt. 94 88242616 and reported enemy working party. Coy listening posts and patrols continue also working parties continue wiring. Strength of Bn. 29 Officers 702 O.R's.
12th	Weather fine, shelling during morning and afternoon in "B", "C" "D" Coy and R.A.P. Areas. No casualties. Capt. Emerson Bde I.O. and Lt. G.S.D. King Bde. J.L.O. blown up in Jeep on striking a mine area 88422643. Both escaped uninjured. Advance Party leaves for DEIR DAAYSIS.
PUNCH BOWL	1930 hrs. "O" Group conference giving final instructions for move to DEIR DAAYSIS Advance Party from 7 Green Howards arrives. Fighting Patrol under Lt. F.G. Sarah to Pt. 94 88242616 with object of taking a prisoner. 2/Lt. W.C.F. Cross and his Pl. were the covering party. The patrol failed to make contact. Coy Patrols and working parties continue. Weather fine. During afternoon 60 mortar bombs fell in "C" Coy Area 1 O.R. casualty. Bn. prepares to move out.
14th DEIR DAAYSIS	"A" Coy relieved at 0020. "D" Coy 0040. "C" Coy 0045. "B" Coy 0145. Bn. H.Q 0200. Bn. arrived new area DEIR DAAYSIS at 0500 hrs. During day Bn. settled in and checked equipment. Bn. casualties during operations 1 O.R. died of wounds. 2 O.Rs injured. Capt. A.S.S. Playfoot and 38 O.Rs re-enforcements posted from I.B.D.
15th	Weather fine. Bn. training commenced. Lt. Col. R.M. Burton returned from M.E. Senior Comd. Course. Capt. R.O. Henderson returned from M.E.T.C. Capt. A.S.S. Playfoot posted to "C" Coy. 2/Lt. W.C.F. Cross took patrol to area 882257 NTR.
16th	Weather fine in morning heavy sandstorm developed in afternoon, and evening turning to torrential rain until 2130. Capt. R.O. Hendersen posted to "B" Coy.

17th Rain during night high wind and sandstorm all day. Very cold early morning. Conference regarding night exercise 18/19 Oct.
Object to practice night attack with Bn. forming protection for armour moving on it's left flank. 2/Lt. O.R. True patrols to area 882257. Reports working parties.

18th Westher fine. O Gp conference for night exercise.
1400 hrs. Bn. moves in tpt to area 449873.
1900 Night exercise commences. Capt. A.S.S. Playfoot patrols to area 882257. Reports on enemy minefield.

19th Night exercise concluded. Bn. resting. Night patrol to area 882257. 2/Lt. O.R. True reports on enemy minefields. Bn. Strength 29 Officers 730 O.R's.

20th Weather good cold early morning. Capt. P.R.H. Kealy joined Bn. from O.C.T U M.E. and posted to H.Q Coy. Night patrols to 882257. Continued checking on enemy minefields.

21st Weather good. Bn. prepares to move to A.A. area NORTH of TWYFORD GAP (889257 - 889258) prior to operation LIGHTFOOT.
O.I. No.1 issued. Lt. Col. R.M. Burton addressed all officers on the war situation and the Bn. future role in operation LIGHTFOOT.
Night patrols continued. Admin. Inst. No.1 issued.

22nd Weather good. Lt. Col. R.M. Burton lectured to each Coy in the Bn. role in the forthcoming night attack, operation LIGHTFOOT.
Bn. moves to A.A. area NORTH TWYFORD GAP. Night patrols contd... operation order No. 4. issued.

23rd TWYFORD GAP. Weather good. Bn spends day resting in preparation for attack. for-night attack.
D Day 1000 hrs. O Group conference, see O.O. No. 4 attached.
The role of the Bn. was :-
1. To protect the Rt. Flank of 7th Armd. Div. during its penetration of JANUARY FEBRUARY Mine Field area 882257 -879257.
2. Form Northern Plank of Bridgehead for the protection of mine field gaps to secure them against counterattacks.
To attain this object the Bn. had to attack across JANUARY minefield and capture TRIG POINT 116 area 87952576 and a further point 116 area 87952576

1900 hrs. Bn. left A.A. TWYFORD GAP and moved to F.U.P. 88502570 here, they shook out in assault formation.
2030 hrs. Bn. leaves F.U.P. and proceeds to start line 68352570 arriving 2125. Our artery barrage commenced 2130 (see trace attached O.O. No. 4)
2140 hrs. Bn. comes under heavy enemy mortar and arty fire, a few casualties sustained.
2200 hrs. Advance from start line under heavy fire in assault formation.
Contact broken at times between Coys, on account of waddies after short advance. Bn halts for our arty: barrage to lift, advance continues. Bn under heavy fire from M.G's, mortar, and arty: Casualties sustained, Major R. Fairbairn wounded, Major E.W.D. Stillwell killed, Capt. R.C. Henderson killed. Visibility became very bad owing to shell fire, contact was lost between Coys. The C.O. with Major J.C. Colebrook O.C. "A" Coy, Capt J.R. Mills. "D" Coy, 2/Lt. T.H. Kemp S.O. with a small part of A & D. Coys advanced very quickly and lost contact with the rest of the Bn. This party undoubtedly reached the objective but owing to the smallness of their numbers and the inability of the rest of the Bn. were unable to hold this position and were captured, Major J.C. Colebrook was wounded.

24th The Bn. was now scattered, at about 0300 hrs. under the Adjutant's instructions the Bn. withdrew 500 yds North East to a Waddie 88182575 approx. where it reformed under Capt. P.R.H. Kealy, the approx. strength was two Plns. The Adjutant was evacuated from here, having been badly wounded prior to the withdrawal, Carriers and Mortars under Capt. K.A. Jessup were unable to make contact.

Contact had not been made before as R.E's were unable owing to heavy fire to make gap in minefield JANUARY. At 0530 hrs approx. the Bn. took up a defensive position facing NORTH in area 88052575. During the day many prisoners are taken due mainly to our arty fire.

Bn. personnel from the Battlefield collected at the R.A.P. area during the day and were organised by Capt. R.D. Griffiths to reinforce at dawn, the personal. holding the bridgehead.

The Bn. however relieved by the 2nd Buffs at 2000 hrs. The Bn. had been shelled heavily for the entire day, the Armoured side. having failed to cross FEBRUARY minefield and were congested in the Bn. area. The C.O. was killed while under escort as a P.O.W. the party came under cross fire from our own and enemy. M.G's in the confusion Capt. J.R. Mills and 2/Lieut. T.H. Kemp with several O.Rs. managed to escape.

Bn. Casualties were:- Lt. Col. R.H. Burton missing believed killed.

2/i/c Major E.W.D. Stillwell killed.

"A" Coy Condr. Major J.C. Colebrook wounded believed P.O.W.

"D" Coy Comdr. Major R. Fairbairn Died of wounds.*

"C" Coy Comdr. Capt A.F.W. Parsons Died of wounds.

"B" Coy Comdr. Capt R.O. Henderson killed.

"HQ" Coy. Comdr. Capt P.R.H. Kealy Wounded.

"D" Coy Capt. J.R. Mills wounded. Lieut. D.L. Fennell wounded. 2/Lieut R.C. Davis wounded.

2/Lieut O.R. True. O.Rs. 33 killed. 37 missing. 99 wounded. The Bn. moved from TWYFORD GAP by transport under Bn. arrangements to area 429869.

25th 428969 Weather good, heavy rain during night. Bn. resting and checking numbers and equipment. Capt. W.D. Griffiths assumes comd. of Bn. Capt. F.C. Freeman becomes, Adjutant. Church service held by Padre.

26th Due to casualties Bn. re-organised on a 3 Coy basis plus support Coy. see attached Pt. 1. Orders. Capt. K.A. Jessup Comds. "A" Coy. Capt. A.W.S. Playfoot "B" Coy. Capt. J.R. Mills "C" Coy. Order to move to defensive positions along NUTS minefield area TWYFORD NORTH GAP 88802578 to No.1. Armour Gap 88802563. O. Group Conference on move.

27th TWYFORD GAP. Morning cold weather good.

0900 hrs. Bn moves by march route to new area. "A" Coy area TWYFORD NORTH, "B" Coy TWYFORD SOUTH 1. "C" Coy area No. 1 Armoured Gap.

Bn. HQ behind "B" Coy. Pl. from Bn. takes part in mook battle for films.

28th Weather good.

Brigadier addresses all officers and O.Rs on the operation. LIGHTFOOT and the war situation on the entire front. Six Officers and 47 O.R's posted to Bn from I.B.D. Lieut. R. Carver, posted to "C" Coy. Lieut. A.R. Lugg posted to "C" Coy. Lieut S.E. Brown posted to "B" Coy. Lieut E.S. Corbett posted to "A" Coy. 2/Lieut. H.F. Burdett posted to "A" Coy. Congratulatory message received by the Bn. from Divisional Comdr. on the Bn's splendid work on Operation LIGHTFOOT OT. Lt. Col. R.H. Senior D.S.O. rejoins the Bn. from the 4th R.W.K. and assumes command.

29th* Weather good. Bn. receives orders to move to Area 44688937 O Group conference on move. 1815 Bn. moves in transport to new area.

30th WADI EL GIWIY. Bn. move completed. Weather good. Bn resting. Lt. Col. R.H. Senior D.S.O. addresses all WO's & N.C.O's of the Bn.

31st Weather good. 5 Officers and 34 O.R's posted to Bn. from I.B.D.

Lieut. E.M. French posted to Mortars, 2/Lieut. B.G. Meara posted as 2i/c of. M.T. Lieut. G.H. Geurchi posted to 5 Pln. A/Tk. Lieut W.G. Davis posted to 4 Pl. Lieut A.C. Worrell posted to "B" Coy. The Bde. came under Comd. of 7th Armoured Div. and will be motorised.
1800 hrs. Lt. Col. R.H. Senior DSO addressed all officers on the Bn. good record and also welcoming the new Officers to the Bn.
